Micah 6:8

Read Galatians 3:28. How do I view and treat everyone as equal?

Read Micah 6:8. What does "do justice" look like in my life?

There are steps personally I can take to address racism

- 1. Understand we all stand equal before God- Genesis 1:27**

- 3. Build bridges of equal relationships- Galatians 3:28**
