Dear Praying Brethren,

Time seems to go faster in the midst of busyness and changes. We recognize we haven't communicated in a timely fashion what the Lord has been doing in the last months. Please forgive us for this fault, and pray with us that we might be able to fulfill that important responsibility so all our constituents may be meaningful participants of the ministry in Gualeguaychú.
