
Sunday, January 23, 2022 Sermon Series for January 2022: "The Heart of Worship and the Heart of God"



We all have received offers with the incentive, "No cost or obligation." We like our worship the same. God says differently. True worship involves sacrifice on our part- a giving, humbling of ourselves before and to God.

The high priest received and offered blood sacrifices for the sins of God's people. Read <i>Hebrews 9:27</i> . How does Jesus' sacrifice compare to what was required of the Israelites? Which system is a part of your life? How do we sometimes live as if the old system is still in place?
Biblical Worship is Focused on God's (Exodus 40:34) How is God the center of my life and worship?
Read 1 Corinthians 3:16,17. How do I see myself as God's temple?
Am I more tied to a place, or being the place where God lives?
