



**“We Still Need Miracles”**  
*Luke 7:11-17 and Mark 16:1-8*

What goes through your mind when you hear the word, “miracle?” What was the last miracle you saw?

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Resurrection Sunday is all about the miracle of Jesus rising from the dead, fulfilling and confirming his mission. Read *Mark 16:1-8*. Do I focus more on the fact of the resurrection or the miracle it displays? How does my answer reflect in my life?

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Miracle of the resurrection points me to \_\_\_\_\_. Read *Joshua 24: 14,15*. What miracles does he ask Israel to remember?

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What would my list of miracles in my own history look like?

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Does my life point to the miracle of God or something else?

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Read *Luke 7:13-15*. How does Jesus’ respond to the tragedy he confronts?

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How does my response to tragedy compare to Jesus? What can I learn?

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Jesus responds to the tragedy of Lazarus, “I am the resurrection and the life.” Can you name a way in which you brought life into a tragedy in someone’s life? How has someone brought life into your tragedy?

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Read *1 Peter 2:24*. The greatest tragedy God has responded to has been our broken relationship with himself. How has God’s response to your sin changed your life? \_\_\_\_\_

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Miracles Prove the \_\_\_\_\_ of God. Read *Mark 16:1-8* again.

What truth does my life proclaim?

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In *1 Corinthians 15:1-8* Paul says the life, death and resurrection of Jesus were of first importance to him. What is of first importance in my faith? What would others say if they were watching me?

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Easter, the resurrection of Jesus is a celebration of a miracle by God for all of us. How will I allow this miracle to change my life this year? How will it change the lives of those around me?

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
