As I examine my own life and life with God, what consequences can I see at work for having my attention divided?
Read and reflect on <i>Deuteronomy 4:39,40</i> . What might God be saying to you from this verse today?
Which area of my life that is divided do I need to see God bring healing?
Take a moment and invite God back into that area now.

Read <i>Ecclesiastes 12:1-14</i> . Solomon's final words on his life are to "remember the Creator of your youth." How has your relationship with God changed over the years? What part of your earlier relationship would you like God to help you recover?
