Did I Miss My Turn?"
2 Corinthians 7:9-10

How often do you get lost? Do you talk back to your GPS?

Turning around is not very easy for us. We tend to be certain, adamant, prideful that "we know where we are going." Yet the ability to turn, to pivot is hard for many because it is an admission I may be wrong. In *2 Corinthians*, Paul is writing to one of Jesus' churches that is heading in the wrong direction and telling them, pleading with them to turn around. It is the same message that has been there to God's people throughout the OT- "Head to me and find life."

God's call of repentance is a call, not just to turn away from something or someone, but a turn towards someone, God, and the things of God.

Read *1 John 1:8-10* and *Proverbs 28:13*.

What do these verses instruct me to do regarding repentance?

_____ God's best for me

Read *Psalms 119:57-60* and *Acts 26:19-20*.

What is God's best for me? Am I turning towards these things?
