# Sunday – February 18, 2024



The early church has always been highlighted for its rapid expansion. We see and herald the bold preaching, the willingness to stand up for what they believed, the signs of the Holy Spirit. Too often, one of their greatest strengths is often overlooked, the power and spirit of their radical giving, motivated by God's radical grace to them.

# KEY VERSE: "and much grace was upon them." (Acts 4:33)

"All the believers were one in heart and mind" (Acts 4:32)

Radical brings radical unity

## Read Acts 4:32-27.

In your own words, how would you describe the life of the people in this early gathering of followers?

What is the difference between unity and uniformity? As a follower of Jesus, which do I focus upon more? How can I tell?

### God's Grace \_\_\_\_\_ Radical Generosity:

"No one claimed that any of his possessions was his own, but they shared everything they had. There were no needy persons among them. For from time to time those who owned lands or houses sold them, brought the money from the sales and put it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to anyone as he had need." (Acts 4:32,34,35)

I give radically because I have been given

Old Testament word is "tithe" to describe giving. (Lev 27:30) It was the beginning of someone's gift to God, not the end result. It was the first 10% of your best.

What is my understanding of giving in scripture and how do I practice my belief?

Acts describes the attitude of the early followers regarding possessions as "no one claimed that any of their possessions was his (her) own." How does that differ from my personal understanding of how I view possessions today?

Read 2 Corinthians 8:1-5. What do I see described as the attitude of the Macedonian church towards giving? How can that change my attitude?
