Ministries RBC Support:

BENTLEY:

Praise that they were able to attend meetings with all of the Pioneers Area Leaders, Regional Leaders and International Office leaders at a center in Nairobi, Kenya. There were several days of training for the almost 60 Area Leaders of Pioneers from around the globe.

Approximately 42% of the world population is yet to be reached with the Gospel. More than 7,000 people groups remain classified as unreached. Pray that God guide us in extending our “reach” with the Good News of Jesus - that He send more laborers into his harvest fields.

The work of the Quechua radio station, Mosoj Chaski, is going strong with the new director. It has been discipling the Quechua people for 25 years. Please pray for its continued work.

Praise for a group from Massachusetts that came to work with the children-at-risk program.

Pray for Santiago Mica, the principal trainer of the mobile Quechua Bible training, one of a few ministry trainings for the Quechua people. It is a tiring role and another trainer is needed to advance the program.

HINZMAN:

Wendy plans on moving to Walton Beach, Florida in June, 2024, and opening to guests in July 2024.

She hopes to provide rest and transformation for global workers. 50% leave within the first 5 years. Most relate they can't take the rest they need because of lack of funds. The Blessing will be free of charge if enough money can be raised. The need is for \$2,000 per month.

Pray for guidance as they prepare for next year knowing that 25% (seniors) are graduating and leaving meaning many of the student leaders and 25-30% haven't arrived at campus yet.
