
Sunday – October 12, 2025 Fall Series: Why Church? Why Not?

INTRODUCTION

Fauja Singh is a global icon, set records by running marathons across multiple age categories, including when he was over 100. He began running at 89 and ran nine full marathons between 2000 and 2013, when he retired. Grandma Moses started painting at the age of 78. Nola Oakes at the age of 95 received her bachelor's degree and went on for her master's- why wait? When do I stop flourishing in life? Have I stopped before God was done with me?
