## Circles of Life

At the start of the month, we were at the New England Cru staff gathering. Spending a weekend together at a camp on the (very chilly!) shores of Lake Winnepesaukee, we shared stories of what we're seeing God do around the region. **For every student in New England that Cru has seen choose to start following Jesus this semester, staff hung a circle labelled with a name on display. There were 50 some names, with 9 from NH. That's 50 students who've found new life and hope in Jesus!** And an astonishing percentage are from NH, one of the states labelled the least religious in the US. Imagine the ripple effects of these 50 students sharing Christ's love with their roommates, classmates, teammates, professors...

Now imagine these 50 students and others being invited to go around the US and around the world to share this love. Last year Cru in the US sent over 4,600 students on mission trips. This year we're praying for even more. In campus ministry, we often call this month "Go-vember", as we invite students to ask God what He wants them to do with their summers and to consider going to the world.

**Would you pray with us that many students would say yes to going this summer to share the hope of Christ in places where He is least known?**
